

Update on Geotechnical Core Sampling in Clusters

Below is PSOMAS response to the Roads Committee (Committee) concerns regarding the impact of drilling cores during days that we have garbage and recycling pickup.

Irene: I will follow this up with a phone call after 3pm but wanted to give you all the information I know as I receive it.

I spoke with ConformaTECH and they are going to confirm their locations for drilling by Wednesday this week and I will have their map on Thursday if not sooner which I will forward onto you so you will know where they will be drilling and in which order. Number 1 will be the first to be done and so forth.

Then they will call in Blue Stake which will locate the utilities in the area so that they don't hit them when digging.

ConformaTECH will not have their driller on site on Tuesdays or Thursdays as it would be in conflict with your garbage and/or recycling activities and therefore will only be working three days a week. I think this will help ease a lot of minds.

We can talk more shortly but wanted to get this information to you as soon as I got it.

In our follow-up conversation, Heidi told me more:

- * No drilling will be done until they have mapped out their sites and blue stake them.
- * The set-up work starts at 7:00 AM. Since setting up the drilling rig takes a while, she doesn't expect any actual drilling to take place before 8:00 AM.
- * The actual drilling does not take long, the setup & take down does. So she believes they will only be able to do 2-3 core samples per day (14 samples total). Since ConformaTECH will not be drilling on garbage & recycle pickup days (Tuesdays/Thursdays) it will take a little longer to complete the work.
